Over the past several years, I've been highly active in the BJCP as Communications Director, Associate Exam Director, 2015 Guidelines reviewer and a Grand Master II Judge. On the exam side, I've graded or reviewed over 700 exams. I've judged competitions in ten states, and I love opportunities to travel to judge in new places and meet new judges. What I hope is clear from this statement is that I take pride in helping out and getting things done.
